Since 2007, use of the Roman Missal of 1962 has been broadly permitted within the church. This creates, in effect, two liturgical years running concurrently. In Advent to Pentecost, Abbot Patrick Regan compares the prayers and prefaces, readings and rubrics, calendar and chants of the 1962 Missal with those of the Missal as it was revised following the Second Vatican Council, now in its third edition. The result is a striking demonstration of the splendor and superiority of the reformed Missal over its predecessor, at least as far as the liturgical year is concerned. Regan's chapters on Advent, Lent, and the Easter Season are particularly informative because these seasons are so different in the two missals. Perhaps less obvious are the differences between Holy Week and the Triduum. Regan not only describes external modifications in the services as restored by Pius XII in 1956 but explores deeper theological currents, especially in the relationship between the passion and resurrection of the Lord in the one paschal mystery, to show how advances in this area find expression in the current Triduum celebrations and throughout the fifty days of Easter. The originality of the book lies mainly here. The most urgent liturgical challenge today, the author contends, is to raise the ars celebrandi to the same level of excellence as the Missal itself.

From USCCB Publishing, this revision of the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) seeks to promote more conscious, active, and full participation of the faithful in the mystery of the Eucharist. While the Missale Romanum contains the rite and prayers for Mass, the GIRM provides specific detail about each element of the Order of Mass as well as other information related to the Mass. The dissertation narrates the process of simplification of the Ordo Missae of the 1570 Roman Missal according to the principles of Sacrosanctum Concilium. The primary objective of this dissertation is to present the process for the approval of the simplified Ordo Missae and presenting how this was discussed in the Second Vatican Council. In order to justify the other changes done, the ancient liturgical books were also presented. Through this presentation, a complete overview of how the new Ordo Missae of the Missale Romanum 1970 was produced. The dissertation is divided into four parts. The first part is a discussion of Sacrosanctum Concilium and its approval of simplifying the Ordo Missae. The second part is a discussion of the Missale Romanum 1570 and the theology behind the change. The third part discusses the ancient liturgical books and the historical justification of the liturgy scholars for the changes that produced the new Ordo Missae. The fourth part presents the simplification done to the Ordo Missae of Missale Romunum 1570. Despite the reactions against the simplification of the Ordo Missae, during the Council and after the Council, the publication of the new Ordo Missae is in congruence to the will of the Council Fathers. Not only the general principles but also particular changes in the Ordo Missae were opened in the floor for discussion. Those changes that were further introduced by liturgy scholars are based on past liturgical books that are validly employed based on the same criterion used by the liturgy scholars at the time of Pope Pius V, that is, the ancient codices that are currently available in our time. Further, MR 1570 still exists as another form of the Roman rite of celebrating the Mass. Now it is its extraordinary form. Latin is still employed and all the pious gestures and devout prayers are still preserved and can be celebrated. It all depends upon the desire of the faithful whether they prefer this form of the Mass. The number of parishes and religious houses who offer the Extraordinary Form of the Mass is fast growing.
